

Dear Friends and Family,

June 14, 2015

Thank you for your sacrificial gifts and prayers for me enabling me to go and minister in Cambodia for 6 weeks. I would not be here without you. I have now been in Cambodia almost a month and know I am overdue for an update. The Lord has blessed me with good health and spiritual refreshment as I fellowship with the believers here. Since I grew up in Southeast Asia, I am accustomed to warmer weather in the 80's with air conditioning but have had to adjust to the 90+ degree days without any AC in the house during the daytime or evening when we go to bed. However, the Lord continues to give abundant strength each day and adequate rest in the evenings.

When I arrived in the capital, Phenom Penh, I had the privilege to meet with two young ladies who became believers under Hubert and Mary Broeckert's ministry in Koh Kong. Lekina is in year 3 of an 8 year medical school program. Pan Ya is in her first year of college education studying to be a civil engineer. Pan Ya's parents initially rejected her and told her she would have to leave the home if she did not recant her faith. Since that time her parents have reconciled with her and her brother has become a believer. Please pray for both of them to be bold in their witness for Christ in their schools and with their families when they are home.



After arriving to the coastal city of Koh Kong, I had the opportunity to see the ministries the Broeckerts have. Hubert teaches several English classes every day with the requirement that the students attend one of the Sunday services each week. Many of his students have been saved through this ministry. I am helping Mary teach an English class to 3 young students by teaching the Bible story for about 15-20 minutes before the English portion of the class. Please pray that God would continue to use His Word to grow and strengthen the faith of these young believers. On Sundays we worship the Lord with a small but faithful group of believers in the morning, with an English service in the evenings geared toward evangelism. The Broeckerts will be turning the church over to a national pastor sometime within the next year, Lord willing. Lalin, the young man who has been training with Hubert for the ministry for many years, owns and operates a small ice cream and hamburger shop which is transitioning to a new location. Lalin views his shop as a ministry location and witnesses to customers and keeps Khmer literature and Bibles for his customers to look at during their visit. Please pray for him as he prepares to take over the pastorate of Koh Kong Baptist Church and transitions his ice cream shop to a new location which is currently under construction. His new shop location will also be the meeting place for Koh Kong



Baptist Church when the Broeckerts go on furlough next year. I was very blessed to witness three young believers being baptized in the Gulf of Thailand this past Sunday. Please pray for these and the other believers in the church as they face real persecution and rejection from their families for believing in Christ, and please pray that they would continue to be bold in their witness and testimony before their unsaved family and friends.



Going to the hospital with Dr. Mary every day has given me the unparalleled opportunity to see and participate in many cases and procedures. It is such a privilege and joy to work alongside the staff here. They love teaching me everything they know and are so incredibly patient with me, despite the language barrier. Praise the Lord that I got my first IV started earlier this week after much help from another Cambodian student nurse! It may seem small, but this is a milestone for me. In my time here, I have witnessed both the joy of birth and the sobering reality of death. I am continually

reminded that the Lord has numbered all our days and that the power of life and death ultimately belongs to Him. Some of the skills I am learning at the hospital include doing physical exams, ultrasound exams, starting IV's, drawing blood, taking vital signs, interpreting X-rays, discussing patient diagnosis based on symptoms and histories with doctors, and many more procedures. Some of the cases I have seen and worked with include pneumonia, cancer, anemia, AIDS, liver cirrhosis, and many other illnesses. We thank the Lord for the opportunities He gives us to share the gospel with both the staff and patients here. I also had the opportunity to meet with a young lady named Mi Sing at Lalin's shop last week. She works at the hospital and used to attend Hubert's English classes. She has heard the gospel many times but is hesitant to become a Christian because she is afraid of her parent's rejection. I went through the gospel again with her and encouraged her to trust in Christ as her Savior. She has not yet made a decision to trust Christ and is still thinking about it. Please pray for her salvation. I may have another opportunity to meet with her again before I leave at the end of the month. A recently graduated student nurse from Faith Baptist Bible College, Renee Boswell, has also been a huge blessing and encouragement to me. Her love for the Lord and other people is evident in her life. I pray that the Lord will use her greatly both here and wherever the Lord directs her in the future.



Thank you again for your prayers and support. Please continue to uphold me in prayer and pray that the Lord would keep using me to further His kingdom wherever He directs me. This week I will be traveling to Thailand to get my visa renewed, and on June 26th I will be leaving Cambodia to stay with my parents in Taiwan. Thank you again for your encouragement and support. I pray that the Lord will continue to bless and keep you all as you faithfully serve Him wherever He has appointed for you.
